9/11, preferably that weekend. We now have 14 routes – Route 8 was split between 8N and 8S. There are about 30 Rotarians helping out. Special shout out to Jim Romano and Scott DeArmey for organizing the staffing and also stepping in to help out on the routes. Also a special shout out to Jeff Bench, who helped Jay "grind" some more ground stakes. Also, a welcome and thank you to Linda Botts who is now helping with the administrative side. She will be working with the flag mapping program and doing additions and corrections! WELCOME to the team Linda!!! We still need volunteers, anyone that can give just a little of their time to help would be greatly appreciated...you don't necessarily need to do an entire route or do every holiday. The more hands to help, the faster it goes! The Veteran's organizations we donate to really appreciate what we do!

Joe gave an update on the Hurricane Debbie flooding disaster that we are helping with up in Sarasota. In the Pinecraft area, the Amish area off Bahia Vista in Sarasota, we helped with about 15 homes and then another 20-25 homes in the Laurel Meadows area. We mostly "mucked and gutted" the homes that had water 3-4 feet deep. Last Saturday he had over 100 volunteers working at Laurel Meadows. Our disaster trailer was loaned about 40 industrial sized dehumidifiers for these homes. We are retrieving those now. There are also trailers we borrowed from Vero Beach, that we must get their tools back in and return. Joe shared the EOC statistics - there was about \$55 million worth of damage, and this was a mild storm compared to lan! There were over 277 homes with serious damage, with 1000 more effected. The EOC has approved over \$3M in assistance....about \$20,000 per home on average. Saturday Chuck and Joe will be moving the Disaster Trailer down to the Boone Law Firm parking lot. They need some volunteers to help sort through the tools and put them in the proper trailer. They will need to do this over the next 2-3 weeks. Please, if you can find the time to help, reach out to Joe! Joe also gave a shout out to a group of special Rotarians that spent a lot of time volunteering and helping in Laurel Meadows... THANK YOU especially to Linda Botts, Jerry Downs, Kevin McCarthy and Casey Riley...you all exemplify what Rotary is all about!

Casey then informed the club about the Rotary Open. Last year this was for 21+ years of age participants (run by Venice Main Street then). This year we are making it family friendly! We are also allowing non-Venice Main Street merchants to be involved. We are pairing up a business that does not have a downtown store front with one that does have a storefront. They are also offering a "rent a pro" with the VHS golf teams. VHS Interact Club will help with volunteers, and we will also have NONPROFIT booths set up in Centennial Park. The alcohol will need to be on private property – we need someone to volunteer for that. We will need someone to help with registrations, checking ID's, trash clean up. It will most likely be hot,

so many short shifts would be advantageous to the volunteers, that way we don't get volunteers overheated, but it means we need many volunteers. The event will be held Saturday 10/12/24 from 12-6 pm with 18 holes. Last year Venice Main Street made \$6000 profit! We will be looking for hole sponsors...\$100 per hole? Casey has the "rules and regulations" on how to build a hole.

**NEW MEMBER INDUCTION**: Joe asked Jeff Boone, Marion Shelton and Marion's sponsor Kevin McCarthy to come forward for Marion's induction. Marion's classification is "Real Estate". Jeff provided him with his new badge, the Rotary 4-Way Test, The Object of Rotary plaques, our Club Banner, and Joe Pokorney pinned him with his Rotary Pin. Marion will give his new member talk in the future.

### Cart Talk

Jane Mendola shared the CART talk today which was very informative. And at the end had all of us secretly tapping our fingers to our thumbs!

A group of Tasmanian scientists from University of Tasmania's Wicking Dementia Research and Education Center are a step closer to developing a computer test that can detect dementia decades before any memory symptoms emerge!!! They have developed a computer screening test that they have named TAS Test. They have used it on 400 participants where, in the comfort of their own home, record themselves tapping their fingers against their thumbs in a quick test that takes about 30 seconds. The researchers analyze precise movements such as the rhythm of tapping and the speed of the movements and compare to the cognitive test scores which are recorded as part to the involvement in the project.

The researchers found that those with slightly lower cognitive scores (those that have a higher risk of dementia in the future) have slightly less regular rhythm and they tapped slower. These subtle changes they see over time cannot be seen with the human eye, but they do have a computer-generated algorithm they use (using artificial intelligence.). The studies outcomes mean we are a step closer to developing a computer test that can be used at home to detect dementia risk decades before any memory symptoms emerge!

## Program

Joe introduced the Immediate Past President of Sertoma, Laura Benson, to share with us what Sertoma is all about. Laura stated she was surprised that she was invited to a Rotary meeting... she jokingly said if she would have invited any of us to Sertoma, she would probably have been kicked out! She thanked us for being braver than Sertoma. She and Casey were Presidents of their clubs at the same time.

Sertoma stands for SERVICE TO MANKIND. It was

formed in Kansas City, MO in April 1921 by 3 people, two of which were doctors. Sertoma's focus is on hearing and speech. This group of three people saw a need for a service organization that could focus on hearing and speech. It has now expanded to a little more than 700 clubs across the United States, Canada, Mexico and Puerto Rico. A fun fact is that the Venice Sertoma club is one of the largest in the country!!!

The Sertoma Club of Venice formed in 1976, and it started as a men's club (they went coed in 1980). The founders were about 20-30 years old at the time. Ed Taylor and Fred Lugar (who has since passed) where two of the founding members. It took 25 local people to come together to get this club going. The belief is they started Sertoma, rather than joining Kiwanis or Rotary, so that they could have a club the way they liked it! They didn't want the weekly requirements that some clubs had. The Venice club's primary focus today is sponsoring a speech clinic for children. They also provide scholarships and sponsor a Little League team. On a side note, the Women's Sertoma Club in Venice is not the same as the Sertoma Club of Venice. There is also a Sertoma Club in Sarasota whose primary focus is on hearing for both adults and children. Sarasota's club has a hearing aid program - you can donate used hearing aids - they will clean them up and refurbish them for others who cannot afford hearing aids.

The Venice Speech Clinic is located at 800 Gulf Coast Blvd. in the Children's First building. They have three clinicians, who last month saw 51 children 121 times! The clinic works on a sliding scale....people pay what they can afford. It can be as small as \$5 per visit. The Venice Sertoma Club raises money to help pay these three clinicians. They just added that 3rd clinician. Most of the clinicians work for the Sarasota County School District as well. They do nights and weekend work at the clinic. One clinician is pretty much available during the day. They try to get these children help at an early age....it can be a speech impediment, delayed speech or maybe stuttering that the need help with. They want to make an impact on the children before they start school if possible.

Laura shared that one of the appealing things of the Venice club today is it was the current members fathers who started the club. It has become a generational club. Their major events are the Wine Fest which is on the 2nd Thursday in November. They raise close to \$25,000 on this event. After Hurricane Irma they donated all the proceeds from the Wine Fest to the Community Foundation who at that time was focusing relief efforts in South Sarasota county. This donation was matched by the Patterson Foundation to help our local residents!

In the past they have manned the beer tents at the Suncoast BBQ bash and they host the Breakfast with Santa.

Last year we worked with Sertoma by participating in

their Charity Rodeo hosted at Fox Lea Farms. Laura stated that together our clubs can work for our one community!!!

### Pay The Lawyer

Jeff started off the fines with fining Laura for attending a Rotary meeting! Jeff thanked Joe for filling in as President today but fined him for forgetting how to turn on the microphone. Casey was fined for grammar...it is not "us" Rotarians...it is "we" Rotarians ....and the pronunciation of the word ancillary - phonetically Casey made it 4 syllables "an-cill-er-rey" we the focus on the "er" instead of a two syllable word "ancill-ery"! Linda Botts was fined for the pretty pink box she has! Bruce Bench was fined for his clothing choice when installing the flags.... Jeff's neighbor (the Gladys Kravit's of the neighborhood) called Jeff again telling him there are homeless people in your yard! Don Lazzaro was fined \$1 for showing up on time!!! Don Lazzaro(\$5) for his daughter Ellen being in town to visit, Mike Sundaram for being asked by his father-in-law to join Rotary (an all men's club at the time), Dave Butler (\$5) for our new member Marion joining the club today, Jim Woods for having Laura Benson as our speaker from Sertoma and not Jim Clinch!, Jeff Boone for being in high school with Jim Clinch, Joe Pokorney (\$10) for the support he received to help with the disaster trailer, Casey (\$3) for Laura speaking, for the 1st annual Putt-putt being a new fun event and for there being no mention of the FSU football in PTL; Jeff Boone (\$2) for UF playing Miami on Saturday and for having women admitted to the VNRC (it washed out a "bad" member back in the day).

The meeting ended with the 4-Way Test!


