about 10-15% below the year before. This year we actively recruited renewing, so this year we started out with more installs than we did last year! Thank You EVERYONE who is helping! If you have interested people, you MUST have their application submitted by 6/17/2024!

The due date for the scholarship applications for the Robert Waldron Scholarship fund has been extended to May 31, 2024. So far, we have 14 applications of those only 8 are eligible, 3 are not in our geographic area and 2 are 2024 high school graduates which are not eligible.

Investment in Youth applications have been submitted and that committee is in the process of reviewing and will meet 6/6 to discuss. Presentation is scheduled for 6/20/24.

Cart Talk

Jane shared possibly some GOOD news on the Alzheimer's front. She covered an article titled "Your Risk of Alzheimer's is Lower Than You Think". The article states that the rate of Alzheimer's disease in the US is falling. Dr Albert Hoffman, chair of the Department of Epidemiology at Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health stated that from 2000 - 2016 the percent of Americans age 65-plus with dementia including Alzheimer's, dropped by 30%! He also stated in a 2019 study the rates had fallen 13% per decade over the previous 25 years in North America and Europe. This was a stretch of time at which there were no drugs on the market to treat or prevent changes in the brain. Since approximately 75% of those diagnosed with Alzheimer's have problems with the blood vessels in their brain, it is thought that all the things we are doing to reduce heart disease and stroke may be related to a lower risk of dementia/Alzheimer's. Other healthy lifestyle changes such as - stopping smoking, keeping you BP and Blood glucose in range, exercising, eating more fruits and vegetables, taking care of your ears/eyes and teeth, pampering your mental health and putting yourself on a regular sleep schedule -are all suspected to have contributed to the decrease!

Jane shared that we have 4 more weeks until the end of the Rotary Year for collecting for CART. Last year we had \$4500 to send to CART - as of last week we are at \$3900. We are \$600 away from meeting last year's contribution....if you can find it in your heart to help get to at least last year's goal, please do! You can bring checks too, besides folding money!!!!

Jane shared the Alzheimer's Poem:

Do not ask me to remember.

Do not try to make me understand.

Let me rest and know you're with me.

Kiss my cheek and hold my hand.

I'm confused beyond your concept.

I am sad and sick and lost.

All I know is that I need you to be with me at all cost.

Do not lose your patience with me.

Program

Casey introduced our own Joe Pokorney as our speaker today. With Saturday being the start of Hurricane Season, it is appropriate that we hear about the Rotary District 6960 Disaster Committee on the "Disaster Preparedness Update". Joe's goal is to explain the District Experience, what we learned from Ian, the 2024 Hurricane forecast and what we need to do. The "Disaster Committee" really started in 2019 by the Charlotte Harbor Sunrise Club. They submitted for a \$50,000 Grant, and they raised \$54,000 in club and individual donations. With these funds they were able to purchase 2 Box Trailers for tools, and they purchased a lot of tools & generators -hand tools and saws for example. They also purchased a Reverse Osmosis Potable Water Trailer - this can process up to 20,000 gallons a day. They purchased a Restroom Trailer (this is for the first responders) there is also a washer and dryer in this trailer. Another box trailer was eventually purchased. These purchases were then donated to Disaster Aid USA, which is a Rotary organization the pays for the insurance and has the appropriate licenses. We (our Rotary District) maintain and house this equipment.

Hurricane Ian (September 28, 2022) experience was valuable. Both tool trailers were used for Mucking & Gutting homes in North Port, Sanibel, Ft Myers and Captiva. We were able to help over 350 families/homes. Our local North Port had horrible flooding with 3-5 feet of water in some homes. The "mucking" part was going into a home and taking all the stuff inside out to the street. This stuff was not salvageable. The next step was to go into the home and see where the water line was and cut out the drywall and that had to also be taken to the street. Once you were down to the bare bones, the boards/studs had to be sprayed with high dose disinfectant to keep mold away. If the water was more than 1 foot high and got into the electrical outlets...they most likely needed an electrician to rewire. The process of getting all this done takes forever! Joe said there were miles and miles of "stuff" on the side of the road.

Our area was lucky, because Lemon Bay Shopping Center, which is privately owned, had an empty "big box store" area that was vacant. The owner "loaned" the area to become a warehouse for supplies. Ian occurred at the same time the District Governors meeting was occurring in MD. Our District Governor, Alfred Current was there and when he shared with the other DG what happened to our District/area...all the DG went back to their districts and the 18-wheeler trucks started arriving with supplies! The warehouse stayed filled for 3-4 months and people could walk in and get what they

needed.

Joe said they did discover that communication was an issue. Cell phone towers were down for weeks. They also discovered they needed more drivers.

In 2023 there was still a trailer down in the Sanibel/Captiva area. We loaned a trailer to the Big Bend area of Florida for Hurricane Idalia that went through in August of 2023. That trailer just returned.

The trailers and equipment are stored at a Rotarian's A/C company, Kobie Kooling. The committee also has learned that they need to monitor the hurricane and move the equipment AWAY from the area. Our district continues to fund grants for hurricane relief.

Joe put up a scary slide...this 2024 Hurricane Season is expected to have 23 named storms (average is 14), 11 Hurricanes (average is 7) and 5 Major Hurricanes (average is 3).

The projects next steps are to restock the tool trailers. They are in the process of creating an inventory management system. They are looking to build water distribution stations. They would like to generate a full Standard Operating Procedure manual. Developing a communication system is also a priority. Most importantly they will be conducting training sessions for Rotarians so that we can all chip in and help. None of this is possible without "people power"!!!

The Disaster Preparedness Committee would like every club to create a Disaster Preparedness Committee (minimum of 2 members). Update and maintain the contact information for each member (DACdb is an excellent resource). Jerry Downs is working on ours!!! Identify the chairman in DACdb and identify the club member volunteers. Establishing a communication tree is very important too. Backup "papers" is a must since technology may fail if there is no electricity!!!

The most urgent needs they have right now are Rotarians with Trucks. They also need individuals that can move trailers on a short notice. They need drivers that are experienced at pulling a trailer! Trucks with tow bars are also needed. You might ask what kind of moves would need to be made...relocating trailers before the storm, moving a trailer to a neighborhood after the storm, relocating a trailer to a different district following a storm and retrieving those loaned trailers after they are no longer needed.

For individuals...be available when a disaster strikes. Consider completing a CERT (Community Emergency Response Training) course. Follow the local preparedness guidance! Join a Disaster Committee! You can complete the District Survey at <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/98RMQZV>

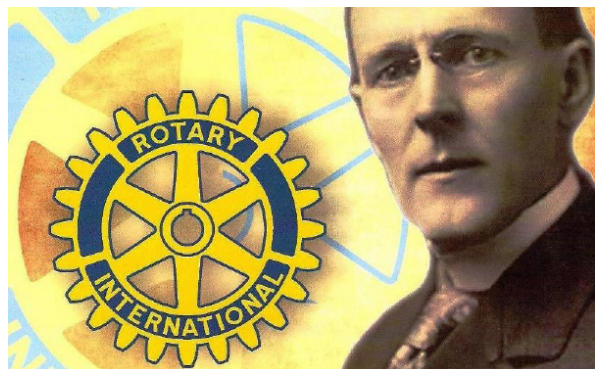
